July 19 – August 15, 2016 Coyote Reporting Summary

Coyote activity sightings have decreased since the June/July report.

Summary:

6 reported sightings total

- 3 of the 6 sightings are of the same coyotes
- 3 of the 4 unique sightings are early morning reports
- No reported cat remains.

Date	Time	Location	Description
7/23	6:55 am	Bostonian & Montecito, Bostonian & Silver Fox, Kempton Park	The coyote looked to be about the size of a German shepherd, which is what I thought it was initially. I first saw the it while driving by a front yard on Bostonian and Montecito; a woman was walking her small dog across the street and the coyote appeared to be looking at her. I then followed the coyote in my car down Bostonian to Silver Fox, where it turned left and sprinted down the street towards Rush Park. It eventually jumped the fence at Kempton Park into the drainage ditch. I honked at it, but it did not seem to be affected. I did see multiple people out walking their dogs, and they all seemed appropriately concerned. (photos of coyote running down street)
7/29	10:20 pm	Foster road and Silverwood drive	A mother and pup ran across the street (Foster RS) diagonally from Silverwood drive. They ran into the lee elementary school parking lot and then behind the classrooms.
7/29	10:30 pm	Foster and Silverwood going into Lee School	Mom and baby in the street heading to the school.
7/29	10:52 pm	11451 Donovan Rd.	I drove my car down Shakespeare Drive and turn left on Donovan Road, a young coyote run in front of my front lawn, on Donovan Road, The Coyote turned into to the street, in front of my car. Then, the Coyote ran off between a
