October 18, 2017 – November 21, 2017 Coyote Reporting Summary

Summary:

The reports this month are mixed evening and early morning. It seems the sightings are slowing down. This could be seasonal or just fewer reports

Recall that coyotes are simple. They seek food, shelter, and water. There is no real way for Rossmoor to eliminate “water” from the list. Shelter for the most part is not available in Rossmoor. So, it comes down to food sources. As long as there are convenient food sources in Rossmoor and the coyotes can get into Rossmoor, they will be here. There’s not an effective way to keep them out beyond the coyote gates that are very effective, but not a complete solution. Coyotes enter Rossmoor via streets and storm drain channels, primarily from the east.

11/20/2017	2971 Copa De Oro	5:00 AM	3 coyotes, one very large and looked to be about 60 pounds. The others around 50 pounds. Running in Street.
11/17/2017	2742 Bostonian Dr	10:20 PM	This happened to my neighbor who was walking her small dog with her cat following behind at By Weaver School in Rossmoor at Bostonian and Kensington. Coyote came up and snatched the cat. She and her friend searched for the cat. No remains found.
11/15/2017	11721 Montecito Rd	9:25 PM	On the Sidewalk next to Rossmoor School, on Montecito, just north of Loring, 2 coyotes were running on the sidewalk next to Rossmoor School, northbound on Montecito
