Summary:

Two reports this month one late night and the other early morning. One is towards the north end of the tract and the other is toward the south end. No real pattern.

3/18/2018	2881 Coleridge Dr	7:03 AM	One large and one medium size; Lrg one about one home away from Foster; all three of us looked at each other; I made loud noise and banged / kicked the fencing. They proceeded west toward Martha Ann then stopped and had a seat in back of someone's home, midway between Foster & Martha Ann. Not worried about me at all.

Recall that coyotes are simple. They seek food, shelter, and water. There is no real way for Rossmoor to eliminate “water” from the list. Shelter for the most part is not available in Rossmoor. So, it comes down to food sources. As long as there are convenient food sources in Rossmoor and the coyotes can get into Rossmoor, they will be here. There’s not an effective way to keep them out beyond the coyote gates that are very effective, but not a complete solution. Coyotes enter Rossmoor via streets and storm drain channels, primarily from the east.
