July 18, 2018 – August 21, 2018 Coyote Reporting Summary

Summary:

Both incidents this month occurred near the northern Rossmoor Storm Channel in the morning. It seems that what activity there is in Rossmoor is currently centered around this area.

8/14/2018	11641 Wembley Rd	6:00 AM	Remains of a full-grown domestic cat, 3/4 eaten to a point where bones were visible Rib cage, end trails discarded to the side of the remains.
7/17/2018	11632 Wallingsford Rd	6:31 AM	Two coyotes. One was fairly tall with a mange ring on its tail.

Recall that coyotes are simple. They seek food, shelter, and water. There is no real way for Rossmoor to eliminate “water” from the list. Shelter for the most part is not available in Rossmoor. So, it comes down to food sources. As long as there are convenient food sources in Rossmoor and the coyotes can get into Rossmoor, they will be here. There’s not an effective way to keep them out beyond the coyote gates that are very effective, but not a complete solution. Coyotes enter Rossmoor via streets and storm drain channels, primarily from the east.
